January 11, 2010

We have been in Jamaica now for a few days. We have had a lecture on Jamaican culture, a tour of Papine -- including the University of the West Indies and the Jamaican Technical University. We have visited the teaching hospital at UWI, have had a lecture on the Jamaican economy, toured Kingston churches, visited a craft market, visited the National Gallery of Jamaica, saw "Pirate Jack" with the LTM National Pantomime Company (which was actually a musical-not a pantomime like we would think), went up to Content Gap in the mountains and visited a rural church/primary school and Blue Mountain coffee farm there. Yesterday, we split up and worshiped at different churches. I worshiped at St. Margaret's Anglican Church and then ate lunch and spent the early afternoon with an elderly couple from the church. In the evening we all attended a local Pentecostal church.

While visiting churches in the Kingston area, we went to one Anglican church that had graves in the

This equates to \$21.83 per member. While this fee is budgeted each year, it is not an easy expense to pay.
