## From The Seminarian's Couch

Deuteronomy 24:5 states, "When a man is newly married, he shall not go out with the army or be charged with any related duty. He shall be free at home for one year, to be happy with the wife whom he has married" (NRSV).

This verse was read two Decembers ago at Holly Presbyterian Church during my husband's and my wedding. At the time we thought it was a funny bible verse that would be fun to have at our wedding, but we were also hoping that God would help this part of the Old Testament law to still apply in our first year of marriage. For a year, God did help that law still stay alive in our lives and my husband, Matt, has been able to stay home.

But now, a little over a year later, as many of you have heard, my husband is being deployed to Afghanistan. I still think it is really early on in our marriage to have to go through such a separation, and it has been rough to say the least. In this past two months I have found myself lamenting to God.

During one of my first laments, my husband was around me and made the comment "Don't say that to God, it's not God's fault." I've realized that I've had this thought too in my past when I hear people blaming God for things that go wrong. Somehow as a culture, we have forgotten that lamenting is okay.

We find laments all throughout the biblical texts: through the Psalms, Jesus' time in Gethsemane, Job, and there is even a whole book dedicated to lament: Lamentations. I think this says something about the Christian story we find ourselves living out of. I think that these scriptures help to give us words to our feelings and help us to not ignore our troubles.

In a way, too, I think lamenting really helps our relationships with God grow. When we think about our strongest and longest relationships with other people,

there has always been something that we have struggled through in that relationship which has made it stronger. I think when we struggle with God in lamenting, we grow -- our relationship becomes stronger, and we learn something about who God is and who we are that is beyond what we know in our minds, but something we know in our hearts and entire being as we have lived through it.

As we are in the time of Lent during the liturgical calendar, we also find ourselves in a traditional season of grief. One way of living this out would be to look through Job or Lamentations, or struggle with why Jesus said, "My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?" (Matthew 27:46b). (Beyond stopping at the thought, "Oh Jesus was just quoting Psalm 22".) I really think that as a community, we can all grow closer to God through our struggles and Laments.

## The Pastors' Corner

Holy Week begins on **Palm Sunday**, March 28<sup>th</sup>, as we welcome Jesus to Jerusalem with Palms and shouts of Hosanna! The crowds that went with Jesus shouted these same words, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of God! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

*"O God, who in Jesus Christ, triumphantly entered Jerusalem, heralding a week of pain and sorrow, be with us now as we follow the way of the cross. ...We thank you for these branches that promise to become for us symbols of martyrdom and majesty. Bless them and us that their use this day may announce in our time that Christ has come, and that Christ will come again. Amen!"* (United Church of Christ Book of Worship)

On Holy Thursday, **Maundy Thursday**, April 1<sup>st</sup> at 7pm we will gather in Fellowship Hall to remember our Lord's Last Supper.

*"We are invited to the table and this table is open to all who confess Jesus as the Christ and seek to follow Christ's way. Come to this sacred table not because you must but because you may. ...Come to this table as you are ready to partake and share. It is spread for you and me that we might again know that God has come to us, shared our common lot, and invited us to join the people of God's new age."* (United Church of Christ Book of Worship)

**Good Friday Services** will be held at Davisburg United Methodist Church at noon. We hear these words from Jesus: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Into your hands I commend my spirit. Forgive them, for they know not what they do."

Beginning at 6am on **Holy Saturday**, April 3<sup>rd</sup>, there will be a **Prayer Vigil** that takes place in homes. This is a guided vigil and can be done even if you are out of town. It is hoped that we will have enough people to go until midnight on Easter Sunday. Please call the church if you want more information and if you would like to participate.
