Jesus Suffered

"Then Pilate took Jesus and had him flogged. And the soldiers wove a crown of thorns and put it on his head, and they dressed him in a purple robe. They kept coming up to him, saying 'Hail, King of the Jews!' and striking him on the face." (John 19:1-3). "So they took Jesus; and carrying the cross by himself, he went out to what is called The Place of the Skull, which in Hebrew is called Golgotha. There they crucified him..." (John 19:16b-18a).

about hell, but about Jesus. We proclaim Jesus has gone to the worst place, the furthest place from God. We proclaim there is no place that God won't go for us. We proclaim that Jesus suffered greatly and that God did not abandon Him in His anguish.

In this proclamation we are given hope. Hope that in our suffering, God suffers with us, and God has suffered the worst, and has conquered. We need to know this when we suffer, when we go through terrible things, when we hurt and are in pain. We need to know that God has conquered through the resurrection of Christ, but we also just need to know that God is with us and understands our pain because Jesus, too, underwent suffering.

Justice and Peace

As your pastors, we have been thinking and praying about the meaning of World Communion Sunday which is also Peacemaking Sunday in the Presbyterian Church, USA. We have looked more carefully at the Book of Order for our denomination and wanted to share a few highlights in reference to Peace and Justice.

Reconciliation: Justice and Peace (W-7.4000) from the Book of Order

"God sends the Church in the power of the Holy Spirit to share with Christ in establishing God's just, peaceable, and loving rule in the world...God's reconciliation in Jesus Christ is the ground of justice and peace. (Confession of 1967) The Church in worship proclaims, receives, and enacts reconciliation in Jesus Christ and commits itself to strive for justice and peace in its own life and in the world....

Justice is the order God sets in human life for fair and honest dealing and for giving rights to those who have no power to claim rights for themselves... There is no peace without justice. Wherever there is brokenness, violence, and injustice the people of God are called to peacemaking."

It is a tall order for us as Christians first, and Presbyterians second, to carry out these mandates for peace and justice. In conversation, Ann has heard a number of parents of teenage girls expressing their concern over the culture in which their children are growing up. They receive mixed messages from media, advertising, and maybe most importantly from their friends; messages about what to wear, and how to act. These women felt that they, as parents, should be as present as possible with their teenagers - as present as all other influences on their lives - by showing interest, caring and concern for their daughters' well-being.
