on Easter Sunday. They say this because they have lived through Jesus entering Jerusalem to the cheers of people (Palm Sunday), then Jesus washing the disciple's feet and being betrayed by Judas in the Garden of Gethsemane (Maundy Thursday). From there Jesus is paraded through the streets and then hung on the cross (Good Friday). For some, knowing that Jesus was nailed to a cross and was left to die is the lowest point in their Holy week. But things began to look up with the lighting of the Paschal candle on Saturday at midnight which symbolizes Christ has risen as the light of the world and the celebration concludes on Sunday with celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Although Easter Sunday has passed and the chocolate is gone, set aside 5 minutes each day to remember Jesus Christ has Risen in your busy day. Don't let the celebration of Easter fade so easily from your life and if it helps buy a bag a chocolate.

Thank You from Outreach! Bringing Easter Joy!

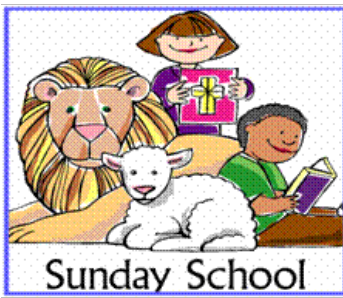

If you've never played, come along and bring a friend as well.

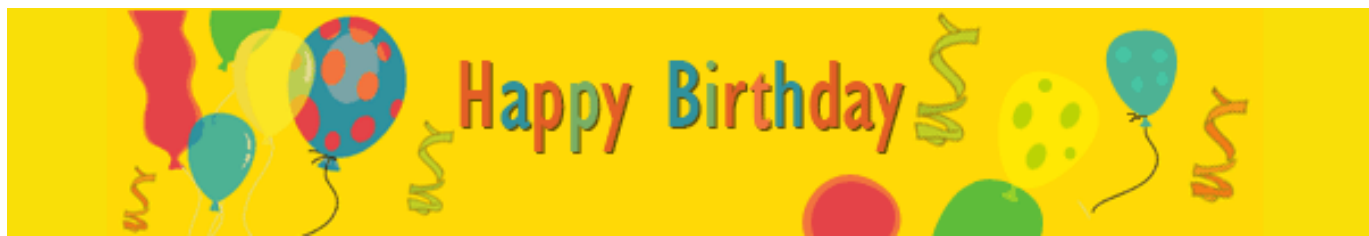

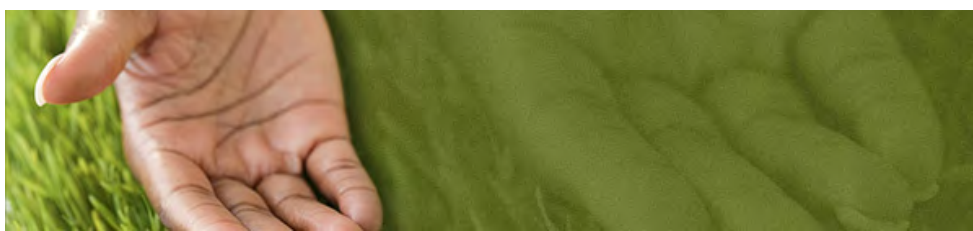
