## A message from Reverend Sharlyn

#### When all is said and done...

See, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them. Isaiah 42:9

As I write this article, it's still the middle of December. In my own life things have changed since I sat in my dad's hospital room and wrote the December newsletter article, back in November. He passed away on November 22nd, just right after I wrote. I have a mixture of feelings from that experience of being there for several weeks. There is definitely grief I feel in his passing. My dad and I had to work at building a relationship, but we did it and for the most part it was good. When all is said and done, we loved each other. I know he was proud of me and appreciated my almost daily calls, which I am missing even though I dreaded calling because his hearing was so bad. We were both often frustrated.

What I know - as a daughter, among many other titles, as a human being, and as a pastor to all of you - is that life and relationships are so tangled up with emotions and memories, with highs and lows and hopefully level places much of the time. Our loving relationships are complicated as we give and take, as we seek what we need in our relationships and do our best to give back as well. As a counselor I have seen pain and separation in relationships, but also healing and growth. As





a minister, I have seen families in conflict but also great togetherness; sometimes it is easy and sometimes it takes a lot of effort.

I guess what it comes down to is that loving is joyful and painful all at the same time. But it's so worth it! I am reminded of a song titled *A Holy Thing to Love* by Libby Roderick that says "It's a human thing, a holy thing to love what death can take; a human thing to love the thing whose loss can cause your heart to break." And at the end it says "Knowing that our hearts will break we love each other all the more."

When all is said and done, loving and being loved is worth any pain we might experience in loss. I write this because my own experience causes me to think back on this past year - and the years I have been here in Holly. And to place myself alongside all of you, my friends. Many of you have loved and lost, yet you reflect the love you knew so beautifully. In my experience in North Carolina, there were so many blessings besides the loss. First of all, your support and encouragement meant more to me than words can express. Knowing I did not have to worry about my place here as your pastor and reading your messages of love was such a blessing! And having the support of many new friends in Rocky Mount, many who were church family to my dad, who became extended family for me - you and they, together, demonstrated what the Kingdom looks and feels like here on earth. No denominational divisions - just pure Christ-like love.

I am taking vacation and going back in January to close out my dad's estate. I am glad I will have that time to slowly go through everything. I'm thinking a lot about what that feels like to close out a life. I think it deserves a little time and care and thoughtful thanksgiving in the process. I know many of you have gone through that process. I have a new and different perspective on your lives, your grief and your experiences because of my own.

As we come into a new year, we look back over all that has happened, all our experiences of work and love, of joy, pain and loss and I pray that all of you can say that in everything there were blessings abounding to make it all worthwhile. We look back, but we also have our eyes focused ahead to see what the new year will bring to us. I am trusting that it will be full of its own tangled relationships, full of love and emotions, of tears and joy. When all is said and done, it is about relationship, isn't it? Our relationships with our most special significant other, our family, our closest friends, our church family. And most of all it is about our relationship with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. For in him we know that we have joy in the midst of grief, we have peace in the midst of conflict and pain, we have hope even when things look hopeless. And most of all we have love a love that is full of promise. And because of his love we can feel very assured that even death is never the end.

May God bless us in our loving and living into the new year, trusting that He will be with us in all things.


