
Basketball Tour-Poland

June 3rd to June 16th I traveled to Poland as the discipler for a men's basketball team. This was my first trip with basketball and I was excited to see what God would do on our team of 9 NCAA Division 1 players. We had players from Baylor, Gonzaga, Valparaiso, Ohio State, UAB, and Mercer. The purpose of our trip was to increase exposure and opportunities for our Athletes in Action staff in Poland through competing well in basketball, while investing deeply in the



lives of the players and coaches on our team.

The weeks leading up to the trip I put together the teams discipleship notebook with materials I planned to cover and prayed for the men by name. I was excited to get to know them and share with them some of what God has taught me. As we departed from Chicago, I could see the challenge that lie ahead as many of these young men were not too interested in pursuing God and several were skeptical about our spiritual "team times." Thankfully, God had prepared me for that possibility and I had some tools on had to try to help them connect with each other. One tool is called Solarium, (http://crustore.org/soularium2.html) which is a set of 50 cards with random pictures on them. We laid them out on the floor and asked the guys to choose a card that best described how they felt about the trip, and then moved as the days progressed and asked them to choose cards that described their view of God and their feelings about Him.
