SERVING IN SPAIN WITH OPERATION TRANSIT

I recently attended our North Africa/Middle East Area Leadership Conference, along with the rest of our ministry's leadership team and several hundred other full-time Christian workers serving 19 countries in our region. For the first time, our entire Area Finance Team also had special meetings there. The overall



Deedee was at the same conference center a few days before me, to meet with the other Area Prayer Coordinators for encouragement, inspiration, brainstorming, and prayer before the rest of the conference began. During the one day we were both there, our three teenagers did a great job taking care of themselves (and of our turtle) back home in Spain! conference theme was "Transform Toward the Goal." We talked about working toward fulfilling Jesus' Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20), and about changing to do this better. We discussed partnership, discipleship, working and growing together, and allowing the Holy Spirit to work in each of us rather than depending on ourselves. I got home with quite a long to-do list from the conference, including preparing for more evangelism teams from the Middle East than we originally expected! Meanwhile, Operation Transit's outreach has been going well, with volunteers coming from near and far to help reach North African travelers with the Gospel. This past month some of our team-members began a training program for local congregations getting involved in our work. We are deeply grateful to the Lord for all of these people, and for this opportunity to work together. We've been excited to see some local churches regularly ministering on the ports in their cities. Please pray that this would happen more, specifically in Motril, Alicante, Tarifa, and Valencia.

Earlier this month, some North African Christian leaders travelled from their own country to Marseille, France, to meet with new believers there. In addition to following up with their fellow countrymen and encouraging them in the Lord, they made arrangements to return this summer with an evangelism team.
