



Work Day—October 5th

We are holding a church workday on Saturday, Oct. 5, starting at 10 a.m. (In the event of bad weather, our backup date is Oct. 12.) For planning purposes it would be best to know in advance how many are coming. So please **send Jim Lyles an e-mail** at jamesmartinlyles@gmail.com; **text or call him** at **248-396-4695**; or send him a private message **on Facebook** to let him know you are coming.

Bottled water and pre-packaged snacks will be provided. Please bring your own lunch. If you have specific tasks you want to work on, let Jim know that too. (If you don't e-mail/call ahead, you are still welcome to show up that day.)



Exterior:

- 1. Remove screen windows from Fellowship Hall and Sanctuary and install storm windows-CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles.
- 2. Tuck point cracks between exterior bricks, Fellowship Hall, west wall, near NW entrance door—CHECK WITH: Broady Cook or Randy Cook.
- 3. Kitchen porch: make changes so it is not slippery when wet—CHECK WITH: Broady Cook or Randy Cook.
- 4. Fill in cracks in concrete at back entrance area—CHECK WITH: Broady Cook
- 5. Landscaping: weeding, remove maple trees and other junk trees growing along the east side of the church--CHECK WITH: Charlee Litten or Vicki Lyles.
- 6. Clean up leaves and other debris in the area around the back entrance—NEEDED: lawn blower.
- 7. Repair flat roof gutter guard that was damaged (bent) when teens climbed onto the roof—CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles.



8. Burn off/remove parking lot weeds—CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles

Upstairs:

- 1. Clean cobwebs at church entrances and where needed throughout the building (also check downstairs).
- 2. Remove fans in the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall and put them into storage (in the west boiler room).
- 3. Put 3 air purifiers in the Sanctuary and 1 in the NE corner of the Fellowship Hall.
- 4. Turn on heat at thermostats.
- 5. Adjust the parking lot lights timer—CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles.
- 6. General cleaning, wherever needed.
- 7. Work on the hinges and fasteners on the cabinet doors in the bathroom next to the kitchen, so that they close better—CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles.

Downstairs:

- 1. Remove A/C window unit from Office and move it to the west storage room—CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles.
- 2. Add plastic to the office and Community Room windows—CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles.
- 3. Tuck point cracks in the Community Room, west wall, near NW corner—CHECK WITH: Broady Cook or Randy Cook
- 4. Water heater (east boiler room): drain a few gallons of water.
- 5. Water softener (east boiler room): check salt level—CHECK WITH: Jim Lyles.
- 6. Turn on heat at thermostats.
- 7. Test both sump pumps.
