One of the more encouraging things in ministry for us is to see student leaders raised up by other student leaders. Pictured to the right is Jimmy, a junior on the Michigan lacrosse team, who recently shared with the group about just that.

During his freshman year, Jimmy was invited by an upperclassmen on his team to join the discipleship group he was leading. Having some spiritual background, but not being sure of where he stood in his faith, Jimmy took the step of faith to be a part of it.

Those early days saw only 4-5 men's lacrosse players attend that weekly group. Yet throughout the years since, God has grown that group to almost 20 players attending each week with Jimmy at the helm leading!
